Attendance Facts

- Attending 4½ days a week
= 90% attendance
= 4 weeks missed per year
- Attending 4 days a week
= 80% attendance
= more than half a term missed per year
- Attending 3½ days a week
= 70% attendance
= more than a quarter of the school year missed



- An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school
- If your child is 5 minutes late every day, they will miss 3 days of learning each year
- If your child is 15 minutes late every day, they will miss 2 weeks of learning each year
