## Safeguarding at Churchfield: Age ratings

Recently, we have had a few children talking about films that they have watched with age ratings much higher than their age. Did you know that age ratings for films is set for cinemas and at home. The recommendation from The British Board for Classification is:

When it comes to DVDs and BluRays, the Video Recordings Act 1984 makes it illegal to supply an age restricted video to any persons under the age stated on the classification. However, once a DVD or BluRay has been supplied it is ultimately a matter for parents or guardians to decide who can watch it in their own home. Nonetheless, the BBFC hopes that the classification, and the associated content advice we issue (eg 'strong violence'), is helpful to parents in allowing them to make informed viewing decisions.
